These marking criteria will be used to evaluate abstracts submitted for LCRF events. The criteria evaluate each abstract based on five key aspects, each rated from 0 to 3. It assesses the clarity of the aims and objectives, the justification and rigor of the methods used, the presentation and interpretation of results, the consistency of the discussion and conclusions with the data, and the potential impact and applicability of the study to clinical practice. A score of 3 indicates thorough and clear explanations, robust methods, well-interpreted results, coherent discussions, and significant potential impact. Lower scores reflect progressively less clarity, justification, and potential impact, with a score of 0 indicating fundamental deficiencies in these areas.
